# Workers' Comp Claim Reporting: What Happens After You Press "Send"?

You've just submitted a First Report of Injury, and the workers' compensation claim process has been set into motion. However, your member responsibility does not end there.


According to NH Statute, the Primex3 Claims Department is allowed a period of 21 calendar days to investigate the claim and acknowledge either acceptance or denial of that claim. If, when the investigation is complete, the work-related claim is accepted, Primex3 is then responsible for following up, with both the member and the employee, as well as the medical providers involved to ensure a safe and timely return to work. The member should also stay in contact with the injured employee to monitor any issues which may arise out of the work place. Once the employee is confirmed for approved work capacity, the member is required to file specific reports. These reports advise Primex3 that the injured worker has returned to work and that the payment structure will need to be changed. Form 13WCA, the Employer's Supplemental Report of Injury, should be filled out and submitted each time an employee's work status changes, i.e., the employee returns to work, the employee is taken [...] [Read More](#)
